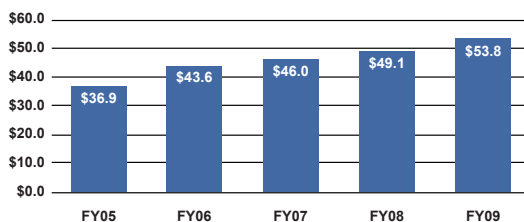


FY2009 | HIGHLIGHTS

Although the School of Medicine's endowment has not been immune to the turmoil in the market this past year, through careful management, the endowment performed better than the endowments of many other institutions.

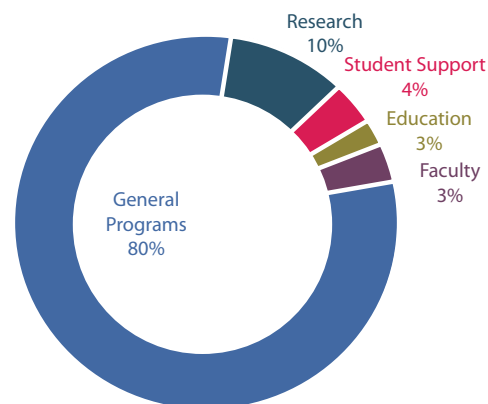

in millions



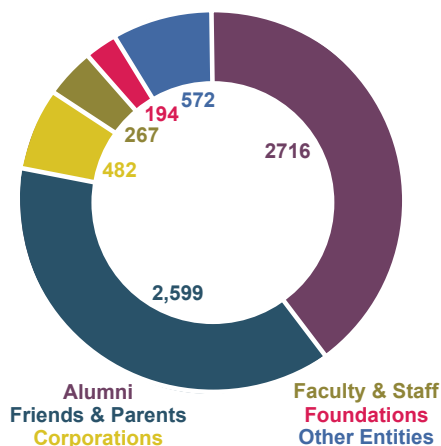
During FY2009, the School of Medicine received more than 6,800 gifts from alumni, friends, corporations, foundations and other organizations. The total number of gifts to the School of Medicine remained steady, despite the dramatic downturn in the financial markets. Gifts made in this fiscal year provided support to educational programs, student scholarships, financial aid, faculty positions and research in the basic sciences and clinical programs.

FY09 GIVING BY ALLOCATION

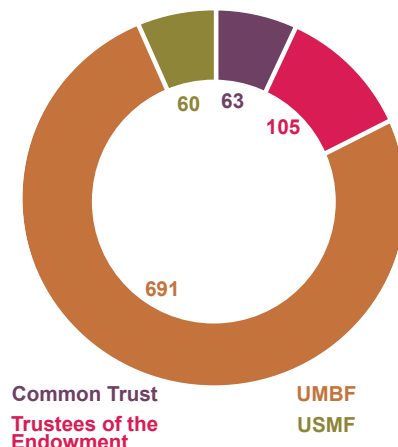


The University of Maryland School of Medicine is supported by over 900 funds, which includes more than 300 endowments. These funds, which are managed by the University of Maryland Baltimore Foundation, the University System of Maryland Foundation, the Common Trust and the Trustees of the Endowment, support faculty positions, scholarships, basic and clinical research and educational initiatives and academic programs.

FY2009 DONORS



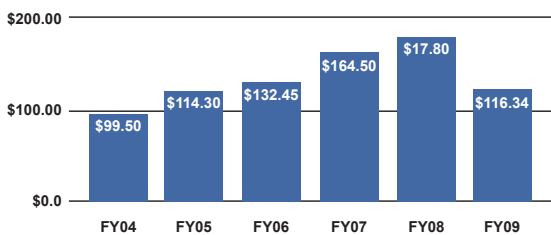
FY2009 FUND ALLOCATION

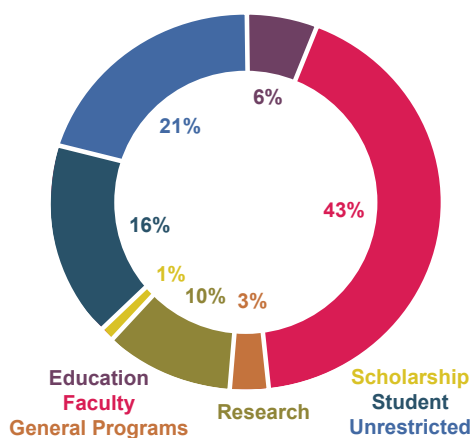
FY2009 ENDOWMENT



With 49 endowed chairs and professorships, named faculty positions remain a central focus of our fundraising efforts. However, the School of Medicine also seeks private support for other initiatives. Educational programs, research projects and scholarship support are also vital to the institution and can be significantly enhanced through private support.

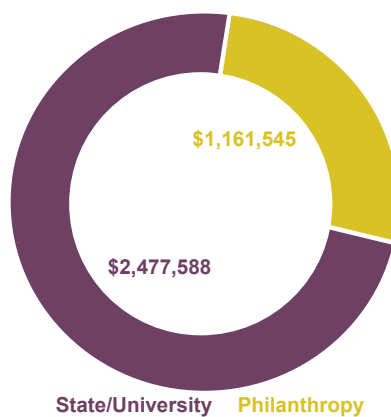
The total endowment, which is currently valued at \$116.5 million, supports six broad purposes throughout the School of Medicine – Educational Programs, Faculty Support, Research, Student Scholarships and Awards and General Programs and Unrestricted.

FY09 ENDOWMENT ALLOCATIONS



In 2009, the School of Medicine awarded 503 medical students with scholarship support totaling more than \$3.6 million. The number of medical students who received financial assistance in FY 2009 remained consistent from FY2008. Of the total funds awarded to students, over \$1.1 million, or 32%, came from private gifts and endowment.
