# ABOUT THE SCHOOL

Chartered in 1807, the School of Medicine is the fifth oldest and first public medical school in the US. Davidge Hall, built in 1812, is recognized as the oldest medical facility in the northern hemisphere used continuously for medical education and is a National Historical Landmark. The nation's first medical school library was established here in 1815, and in 1823, the School of Medicine became the first medical school in the country to construct its own hospital for clinical instruction, becoming the first academic medical center.

The School of Medicine is the founding school of the University of Maryland and today is an integral part of the 11-campus University System of Maryland. Located on the University of Maryland's Baltimore campus, the School of Medicine serves as the anchor for a large academic health center which aims to provide the best medical education, conduct the most innovative biomedical research and administer the best patient care and community service to Maryland and beyond.



# **RESEARCH**

The University of Maryland School of Medicine's first rate research enterprise ranks consistently high among top-tier medical schools. We have a rich tradition of research support from the National Institutes of Health and other federal agencies, as well as from leading philanthropic sources such as the Gates Foundation. Excluding one-time stimulus funding, research funding increased 12.5 percent. Overall funding increased 1.5 percent to \$486.3 million. We rank:

- 7th among 76 public US medical schools in research grant and contract expenditures (Association of American Medical Colleges—AAMC)
- 17th among all 134 US medical schools in research grant and contract expenditures (AAMC)

We are **the fourth** fastest growing research enterprise in America (AAMC).



world-class academic health center.


#### **Faculty Practices**
