Program Updates

We welcomed Ann Toma, academic coordinator for the MGC program in the Fall. Additionally, Allison Mitchell, MS, CGC joined the genetics team at Maryland in November. Allison provides GC services at Baltimore Washington Medical Center (cancer) and in the Adult Clinic at UMD.

In the Fall of 2008 the 1st and 2nd year MGC students participated in a standardized patient encounter. Each student was assigned a case to prep (based on year of training) and then met with a patient actor to demonstrate their individual skill sets. All sessions were recorded and each student was given a copy of their case to review. The MGC program plans to use the standardized patient experience throughout the 1st and 2nd year to help students identify areas of strength and skills to improve upon during their training.

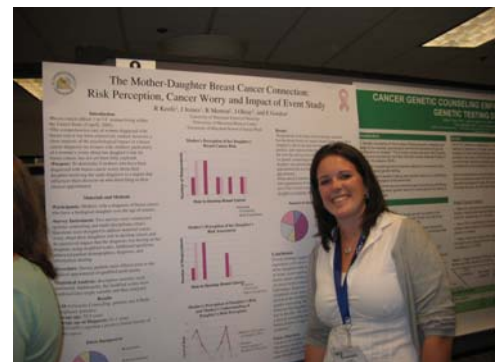
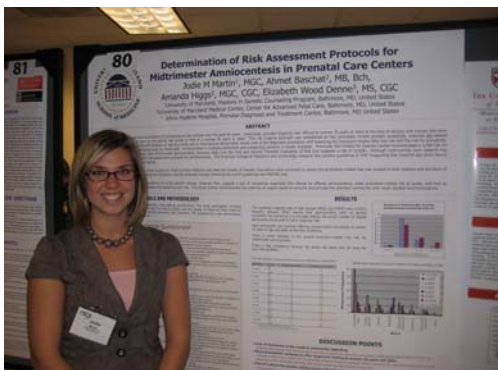
